Dear Parishioners and Visitors of Holy Cross Parish,

At a meeting of Deans last week, the Archbishop reported that the State Government has no plans to adjust the current rulings on church attendance for some time. It seems that the Church is not considered an essential service by the government and that we do not have many employees to care for, or at the least that's the impression our liaison people are getting in their discussions.

Unless there is some miracle, we have to assume that at this point, Christmas Masses will still be subjected to the same restrictions we currently face. Booking arrangements will continue for Christmas **BUT**, with a difference.

Christmas is a time for connecting with those families who only come once or twice a year and the Parish Pastoral Council has discussed the importance of opening doors as best as possible to those who do not usually come regularly.

Outdoor Masses have been considered, but these are beyond us with requirements for expensive security fencing and social distancing between families, not to mention the vulnerability to weather.

Next week, when we advertise our Christmas Masses, we will also open the opportunity for families to nominate for a Christmas Mass, stating the number of people they would like to have come. This will be advertised through the school and, as best as possible and affordably, through the wider community.

There will be a cut-off date for bookings and then there will follow a 'lucky draw'. Those families whose names are drawn will be given a ticket which they will bring to the Mass to gain entry. There will be **NO 'walk-ins'** at the Mass as everyone will need a ticket prior to coming.

It all sounds so unusual but, when we usually get 2000 people coming to our Christmas Masses, the only other alternative to be fair to these 2000 is not to have any Masses at all. You may remember that this was the situation we found ourselves in at Easter.

2020 has been a year of frustration and sometimes, a sense of losing purpose but, the Masses for Christmas will be offered and live-streamed so that there will be some opportunity for participation even if you can't be there.

NOVEMBER MASS OFFERINGS

November, beginning with All Saints and All Souls, is traditionally the time in the Church for praying for the dead.

The tradition of making an offering to have a mass said for a special intention or for the dead goes back to 155AD. Since the Second Vatican Council the Church has retained the practice of offering masses for the dead. A simple way to understand this is that a mass offering is a special gift for a loved one, either one who has died or one who remains. That which we often treasure the most - our money - becomes a significant commitment we make for someone we care about. Canon Law explains that the mass offering cannot be treated as a fee. It is more a donation and these are generally used for works of service, for charity and for opportunities to show gratitude to those who offer service to the Church in mission. Our giving becomes our commitment to what we care about and also becomes a credible contribution to the work of Jesus

Having said that, the Second Vatican Council also acknowledged the role of all the laity in the offering of the mass and how we all bring our intentions to the altar of the Lord. Our prayers at this time are certainly a means by which we all benefit as we share in the life-giving sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

The envelopes for November mass offerings are now available at the entrances to the churches. The special intentions for the November mass offerings will be laid at the altar. Those who cannot afford a contribution should still feel free to put names on the envelope those for whom they wish their intentions made without placing any contribution in the envelope. Everything is confidential.


