

#### Dear Parishioners and Visitors of Holy Cross Parish,

As mentioned last weekend, the opportunity to physically be present at a Christmas Mass will be determined by a ballot. Those selected will be required to have a ticket showing the number of people booked into their respective group. This will enable some of our 'Christmas and Easter participants' to still have the opportunity to celebrate the Mass with us. Also, as mentioned last week, there will definitely be no 'walk-in' possibilities at the last minute.

I must say how delighted I have been to hear the strong support from many of the people of our parish for the approach we are taking to how we will enable people to come to the Masses for Christmas. It shows your missionary heart and that is a blessing to me and a sign of your capacity to think beyond our own wants to the possibilities of bringing the Christmas message to those who rarely connect with the Church.

The completed form should be returned to the parish office or placed in the collection box at each of the churches. If you know of anyone who is unable to physically bring their form to the churches or the office, please offer to bring it for them. If you want your form entered but, have no-one to bring it to us, please contact the parish office to arrange collection.

#### The acceptance of application forms will close at the end of the 5pm Mass on the 20<sup>th</sup> December.

Those who are successful will receive notification by email (or telephone if no email) and a ticket will be made available for collection. I intend that all of the Masses will be live streamed.

I know that some people are finding these restrictions a burden and find it even harder to cope with when things don't go as planned but, I encourage you to hang in there and acknowledge, that we are still living in very good times when compared to the lives of the Christians in the early Church.

#### **NOVEMBER MASS OFFERINGS**

November, beginning with All Saints and All Souls, is traditionally the time in the Church for praying for the dead.

The tradition of making an offering to have a mass said for a special intention or for the dead goes back to 155AD. Since the Second Vatican Council the Church has retained the practice of offering masses for the dead. A simple way to understand this is that a mass offering is a special gift for a loved one, either one who has died or one who remains. That which we often treasure the most - our money - becomes a significant commitment we make for someone we care about. Canon Law explains that the mass offering cannot be treated as a fee. It is more a donation and these are generally used for works of service, for charity and for opportunities to show gratitude to those who offer service to the Church in mission. Our giving becomes our commitment to what we care about and also becomes a credible contribution to the work of Jesus

Having said that, the Second Vatican Council also acknowledged the role of all the laity in the offering of the mass and how we all bring our intentions to the altar of the Lord. Our prayers at this time are certainly a means by which we all benefit as we share in the life-giving sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

The envelopes for November mass offerings are now available at the entrances to the churches. The special intentions for the November mass offerings will be laid at the altar. Those who cannot afford a contribution should still feel free to put names on the envelope those for whom they wish their intentions made without placing any contribution in the envelope. Everything is confidential.


