In an emergency, blessings will come down from above to help you breathe through the moment. Simply reach up. Please follow the directions of Jesus as he announces them in his Gospel and in our hearts.

Let us take this journey together.

The journey of Lent is a pilgrimage – a movement into something familiar to discover something new about ourselves. It is not a holiday. We don't give up time and materials to get away. We give up time and materials to fill our lives with something better.

It is a long journey of self-denial; it is about renewing and increasing our commitment to Jesus and to others. It is a journey because we come to see just how willingly Jesus moved from the temptation on the mountain to the crucifixion, all for the sake of each one of us. He knew that his purpose from the beginning had always been planned by God. As such, he is the pilgrim director.

The journey will conclude in the tomb.

After that, we will have an end of pilgrimage celebration and be lifted into brilliant light and it is this light, which we will carry afresh into every part of our lives. It is the light of resurrection. It was given to us at our Baptism.

Having journeyed through Lent, we will find that this light has the potential to give us a different view of the world and our part in it. It is this light which reminds us that all our journeys begin and end with God.

Lent is an invitation. No-one forces or coerces us to undertake Lenten practices. That is why there are exits everywhere. There are no seatbelts to lock us in. It has to be a choice.

It is a discipline but, nothing worthwhile was ever achieved without discipline.

Strict Guidelines for Mass Attendance

You MUST BOOK ONLINE to attend Weekend Masses. For Weekday Masses you MUST Sign In and supply contact details. This is a requirement necessary for contact tracing for Covid-19. Only those who are correctly booked into the Weekend Masses or Signed in with contact details to the Weekday Masses will be admitted into the Church.

- Entry and Exit at both Churches strictly via the SIDE DOOR (hospitality entrance at Holy Cross Church and the organ side at Mary, Queen of Peace Church).
- Ensure you use hand sanitiser on both entering and exiting the Church and remain socially distanced from other household groups.
- The Church doors will open 20 Minutes prior to Mass beginning and close at the commencement of Mass, please ensure you arrive at least 5 minutes prior to the commencement of Mass.
